# TODAY'S ACTION

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa.; Nov. 6, 2018 -- The Penn State Nittany Lions (0-0, 0-0 B1G), ranked No. 1 in the InterMat Tournament Power Index, will open up the 2018-19 season by hosting No. 24 Kent State (3-1\*) on Sunday, Nov. 11, at 2 p.m. in Rec Hall. Penn State has won seven of the last eight NCAA championships and return a talented line-up for the new campaign. \*Kent State competes on Friday, Nov. 9, post-press.

Penn State is coming off a title-run in 2017-18 that saw it go 14-0 overall and 9-0 in the Big Ten. The Lions enter the new year riding a 45-dual win streak. The Lions had eight All-Americans last year, with four national finalists and three NCAA Champions, winning the 2018 NCAA Championship in Cleveland's Quicken Loans Arena. Seven of those All-Americans, including three of the finalists and two of the champions, return.

Penn State will bring a veteran line-up into the new year with eight returning starters and eight wrestlers ranked in InterMat's preseason individual rankings. Seven All-Americans return for Penn State, including four wrestlers who have won national titles.

Sophomore Devin Schnupp gets the early nod at 125 for the Nittany Lions. Schnupp started much of last season for Penn State during its undefeated dual meet campaign. True freshman Roman Bravo-Young will make his collegiate debut at 133 for Penn State. Sophomore Nick Lee enters the year ranked No. 4 at 141 after posting a 32-7 record last season. He was a true freshman All-American a year ago, placing fifth at NCAAs. Two red-shirt freshmen are in a battle at 149 for the Nittany Lions. Brady Berge, ranked No. 15 by InterMat, and classmate Jarod Verkleeren will be in the mix with Verkleeren getting the nod Sunday.

Senior Jason Nolf enters the year ranked No. 1 at 157. A three-time NCAA finalist, three-time All-American and the two-time defending champ at 157 went 26-1 last year, coming back from a late-season injury default to win the title in Cleveland. Junior Vincenzo Joseph has won the last two NCAA titles at 165 and heads into the new year ranked No. 1 after going 25-2 last year and winning it all in Cleveland. Junior Mark Hall is a two-time finalist who won the 174 pound title in 2017 and made the finals at 174 in Cleveland last year. Hall is ranked No. 2 at 174 and went 32-1 a season ago.

Senior Shakur Rasheed was an All-American at 197 last year after placing seventh and ending the year with a 24-5 record. This year, he moves down to 184 and enters the season ranked No. 4 nationally. Senior Bo Nickal enters the year ranked No. 1 up a weight at 197. A three-time NCAA finalist, three-time All-American and two-time champion at 184, Nickal was a perfect 31-0 last year. Penn State has an abundance of riches at 285 with All-American Nick Nevills or talented senior Anthony Cassar battling at 285. Nevills is ranked No. 2 at 285 and is a two-time All-American. He placed seventh at nationals a year ago and went 30-7 overall. Cassar spent last year at 197 and was ranked as high as No. 5. He went 16-2 overall, including a key win over Ohio State that clinched the Big Ten regular season title for Penn State. He is moving up to 285 this year and will take to the mat on Sunday against Kent State.

Kent State went 3-1 in its opening weekend of action last weekend and also competes Friday night, Nov. 9, post-press. The Golden Flash will come to Happy Valley with one of the nation's top 197-pounders in senior Kyle Conel, who was a national finalist and All-American last year and enters the season ranked No. 2 by InterMat.

Penn State owns a 7-0 lead in the all-time series with the Golden Flash. The Nittany Lions won the last meeting 27-15 back on Jan. 8, 2011, at the Virginia Duals. The Lions won 38-2 in the last meeting in Happy Valley, back on Dec. 2, 1972.

The Nittany Lions will head to Philadelphia next Sunday for the 2018 Keystone Classic at the University of Pennsylvania. The day-long event will take place in the historic Palestra and begins at 10:00 a.m.

# HEAD COACH CAEL SANDERSON

Cael Sanderson is now in his tenth season as head coach of the Penn State Nittany Lion wrestling team. The veteran head coach already has seven NCAA and five Big Ten tournament titles in hand. He has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year five times and was named the 2013 NWCA National Coach of the Year (his second such honor).

## THE PENN STATE YEARS...

His first season at Penn State was solid. Sanderson led Penn State to a 13-6-1 dual meet record, much improved over the prior year's 8-12-2 mark. After a year outside the Top 10, Sanderson led the Lions back to their place among the nation's elite with a ninth place finish at the NCAA Championships and a No. 10 final dual meet ranking from the NWCA Coaches. Sanderson picked up three more All-Americans (including a national finalist) and a Big Ten Champion in younger brother, Cyler Sanderson.

In 2010-11, Sanderson reached the pinnacle of the collegiate coaching mountain by guiding Penn State through a stunning season filled with records, championships and memories that thrilled the Penn State faithful. Sanderson led the Nittany Lions to their first-ever Southern Scuffle Co-Championship and first Virginia Duals Championship since 1991. While guiding Penn State to a 6-1-1 conference mark, Sanderson equaled the highest Big Ten dual meet wins in Penn State history (1998). He led Penn State to the school's first ever Big Ten Championship and was named 2011 Big Ten Coach of the Year. He became the first coach in NCAA history to be named both the Big Ten and Big 12 Coach of the Year. Saving the best for last, he led the Nittany Lions to the 2011 NCAA National Championship in Philadelphia, Penn State's first since 1953 and Sanderson's first as a collegiate head coach.

During the 2011-12 season, the nation watched as Sanderson led Penn State to a 13-1 dual mark, including a school record 7-1 Big Ten dual record to earn a share of the 2012 Big Ten dual meet championship. Sanderson then made it two in a row by leading Penn State to the 2012 Big Ten Championship at Purdue. He was named 2012 Big Ten Coach of the Year, earning the honor for the second straight season. Two weeks later, Sanderson led Penn State to a second straight NCAA crown, helping Penn State to become the fifth team in NCAA history to win back-to-back titles. He was named NWCA National Coach of the Year for the second time in his career at the conclusion of the championships in Des Moines.

In 2012-13, Penn State posted an identical 13-1 mark, 7-1 Big Ten dual record and won its third straight Big Ten Championship in Illinois in March. Sanderson earned his third straight Big Ten Coach of the Year honor (co) in the process. Two weeks after that, Sanderson guided Penn State to a thrilling third straight NCAA crown, helping Penn State to become just the third team in NCAA history to win three straight team titles. At the tournament's end, he was named NWCA National Coach of the Year.

In 2013-14, Penn State went 15-1 overall and won a share of the Big Ten dual meet title with a 7-1 record. The Nittany Lions won their fourth straight Big Ten Championship in Madison, Wis., helping Sanderson win his fourth straight Big Ten Coach of the Year honor. Two weekends later, the Nittany Lions won their fourth-straight NCAA title, becoming the third team in NCAA history to win four-straight NCAA titles.

In 2014-15, Sanderson led Penn State to an 11-4 dual meet record, a fifth straight Southern Scuffle title, garnering five All-Americans and another individual National Champion at the NCAA Championships.

In 2015-16, he added a sixth straight Southern Scuffle championships, a third Big Ten dual meet title (co-) and the 2016 NWCA National Dual Series championship. He led Penn State to its fifth Big Ten Championship in the last six years in Iowa City and followed that up with his fifth NCAA National Championship in the last six years in New York City's Madison Square Garden.

In 2016-17, Sanderson led Penn State to its second-straight NCAA title and sixth in the last seven years. Penn State posted a perfect 14-0 dual meet record, won the 2017 Big Ten regular season (dual meet) title and the NWCA Dual Championship Series crown for the second-straight season. Sanderson's team posted a gaudy 35-6 record at NCAAs and won five-straight Individual championships to close out the national finals.

In 2017-18, Sanderson led Penn State to its seventh NCAA title in eight years and third straight. Penn State posted a perfect 14-0 dual meet record and won the Big Ten regular season (dual meet) title yet again. Sanderson's team posted a superb 39-9 record at NCAAs.

In nine years as Penn State's coach, **Sanderson led the Nittany Lions to seven Southern Scuffle titles, five BIG dual meet titles including this year's, five Big Ten Championships, seven of the last eight NCAA Championships, collected 51 All-Americans, 20 National Champions including an NCAA record-tying five in 2017, four Gorriaran winners, four NCAA Tournament Outstanding Wrestlers, one CoSIDA Academic All-American of the Year, one NCAA Elite 89 winner, one NCAA Top 10 Award winner and four Hodge Trophy Winners.** Sanderson, who has coached 66 total All-Americans and 22 total National Champions (including his three years at Iowa State), grabbed his 100th win as Penn State's head coach in its 36-6 victory over Stanford in Rec Hall on 11/13/16.

# NOTES

## LIONS BEGIN THE YEAR RANKED NO. 1 ACROSS THE BOARD

The Penn State Nittany Lions (0-0, 0-0 B1G), winners of seven of the last eight NCAA titles, will enter the 2018-19 season ranked No. 1 in InterMat's Tournament Power Index (TPI). Eight Nittany Lions are ranked individually, including seven ranked in the top four. Penn State sits at No. 1 in the preseason team TPI with 140.5 points with Ohio State a distant second with 99.0. Oklahoma State is third with 87.0, Iowa fourth with 86.5 and Michigan fifth with 72.5. Sophomore Nick Lee, who placed fifth at 141 last year to become a true freshman All-American, begins the season ranked No. 4 at 141. Red-shirt freshman Brady Berge, who wrestled unattached in open tournaments, begins the season ranked No. 15 at 149. Senior defending NCAA Champion Jason Nolf is ranked No. 1 at 157. Junior defending NCAA Champion Vincenzo Joseph is ranked No. 1 at 165. Junior two-time finalist and '17 NCAA Champion Mark Hall is ranked No. 2 at 174. Senior Shakur Rasheed, who earned his first All-America honor with a seventh place finish at 197 last year, is ranked No. 4 at 184. Senior defending 184-pound NCAA Champion Bo Nickal is ranked No. 1 at 197. Senior heavyweight Nick Nevills, who earned his second All-America honor with a seventh place finish last year, is ranked No. 2 at 285. Penn State is also ranked No. 1 as a team (either TPI or dual) by every other major wrestling outlet. The Lions are also a preseason unanimous No. 1 in the preseason NWCA Coaches Poll.

## NATIONAL TV DATES SET FOR 2018-19 SEASON

The Penn State Nittany Lion wrestling team, winner of seven of the last eight NCAA titles, will have a bevy of games air nationally on the Big Ten Network and ESPN2 this season. All times listed are Eastern. Please note that all dates and times are subject to change. Penn State's home dual with Lehigh on Sunday, Dec. 2, will air nationally on the BTN. The dual will take place in Rec Hall and starts at 1:30 p.m. Arizona State comes to Penn State for a dual in Rec Hall on Friday, Dec. 14, for a 6 p.m. dual that will air live nationally on ESPN2. The 2018 BJC Dual against Michigan on Friday, Feb. 1, will air on the BTN. The dual in the 16,000-seat venue begins at 7 p.m. The Nittany Lions trek to Columbus, Ohio, to take on Ohio State on Friday, Feb. 8, at 8:30 p.m. and the dual will also air on the BTN. In addition, the Big Ten Network will air the Big Ten Championships live on Sunday, March 10. The entire two-day tournament will also stream live on BTN2go/BTN-Plus. ESPN and its family of networks will once again air the entire three-day NCAA Championships on March 23-25 from Pittsburgh's PPG Paints Arena. ESPN will announce details of its ever-expanding coverage later. All eight of Penn State's duals will stream live online as well. Check the Penn State wrestling schedule at GoPSUsports.com for a complete listing. BTN2go/BTN-Plus (\$) and Lionvision (free) will be available for seven of the dates. ESPN typically streams much of its live ESPN2/U contents as well and streaming of the PSU/ASU dual in December will be confirmed later.

## FORMER LION GREAT DAVID TAYLOR A WORLD CHAMP!

Former Penn State wrestling great David Taylor roared through the world's best to win the 2018 World Championship at 86 kg. The four-time All-American, four-time NCAA finalist and two-time NCAA Champion went 5-0 in a two-day run in Budapest, Hungary, to win his first world championship. Taylor began his title run by going 4-0 on day one of the event. The former Nittany Lion opened up one of the tournament's toughest draws by downing former World and Olympic Champion Hassan Yazdanicharti of Iran 11-6. He then rolled to a 10-0 technical fall over Hajy Rajabau of Belarus. Taylor posted an 8-0 decision over Cuba's Yurieski Torreblanca in the quarterfinals. In the semifinals, Taylor met Russia's Dauren Kurugliev and, after taking a kick to the head in the first period, fell behind 5-1. But in typical Taylor fashion, the former Lion roared back in the second period, reeling off six straight unanswered points to post a 7-5 victory and advance to Sunday's World Championship bout. Taylor, the tournament's No. 2 seed, met No. 1 seed Fatih Erdin of Turkey in the championship match. Taylor left no doubt to his dominance by bolting out to a quick 4-0 lead and rolling to a 12-2 technical fall over his Turkish opponent.

## 5 LIONS BEGIN OPEN TOURNEY SEASON AT CLARION

Five members of head coach Cael Sanderson's Nittany Lion wrestling team competed at the Clarion Open today, officially opening up the 2018-19 open tournament season. Redshirt freshman Austin Hoopes went 1-2 at 184.
